Anti-Corruption Commission to Host Inspectors of State Agencies

For Immediate Release: *13 September 2011*

Dili, Timor – Leste On 14 and 15 September 2011, the Anti-Corruption Commission (CAC), in collaboration with the Office of Inspector General (OIG), will host Inspectors of various agencies of government for a corruption prevention workshop. Under the theme ***“Fortify the acting of the employees' service in the combat the corruption and to promote the service coordination between ACC and IGE”***, the two-day workshop is intended to promote coordination between CAC and the OIG and increase inspection procedures in various departments of government agencies.

The objective of this workshop is to strengthen corruption fighting abilities of various agencies of government and improve service delivery to the public. Several personalities are expected to deliver presentations on various topics related to anti-corruption. The Commissioner of CAC, Mr. Aderito de Jesus Soares will be joined by the President of National Parliament, Mr. Fernando La Sama de Araujo; Dili District Prosecutor Mr. Jose da Costa Ximenes and Mrs. Cipriana Pereira, the head of GOPAC. Other speakers include Mr. Fransisco de Carvalho, Inspector General of State; Mr. Manuel Bucar, Deputy Commissioner for Prevention and head of Dili District Tribunal Mr. Duarte Tilman among others.

The workshop is the first effort by the two agencies to unite in the fight against corruption. This effort is expected to lead to a more effective control over state resources by Inspectors and those who are in charge of service delivery to the general public. At the end of the two-day workshop, participants are expected to have:

- Deeper knowledge of inspections and auditing
- Notion of combating corruption
- Knowledge on effective corruption prevention measures.

CAC considers this workshop and many of its program activities key measures that will help it achieve its mandate of combating corruption in Timor – Leste. The Commission has had several such engagements with other agencies of government and with communities across the country.
